
# 1 - Ayre EX-8 Full vs Ayre AX-7e



Question; which amplifier is better?

The sources for both are the Aurender NH100 + Ayre QB9 Twenty The Ayre EX-8 has:


- A much lager (depth and width) and more stable sound stage.
  It projects much mire accurate, sound sources are better shaped over the the whole frequency domain.
- Has more body in the sound (80-150Hz). The AX7-e has the tendency to sound more empty in that domain, with the tendency to sound nasal.
- The treble has more brass and definition, without becoming irritating, sharp or pushy/brittle.
- More authority, and very nice combination of dynamics and control.

#### The AX-7e:

- Sounds nasal die to the lack of mid-low.
- Sound is more concentrated and projected inbeten the speakers
- Is relative (!!!) "lifeless", and has less good timing.

Overall, the beautiful sound timbre of the AX-7 an its holographic projection are outperformed by the EX-8 with more neutrality, without the tendency to become too clinical. On the contrary, it has more grandeur and authority.

Answer: The EX-8 is clearly better on all aspects.



Question; which DAC is better.

Source for both is the Aurender NH100, connected with an AudioQuest Carbon cable. The Ayre EX-8 USB input sounds:


- Flatter; is misses openness and air
- The timber is flatter
- Treble is less rich
- As if you move back to the Ayre QB9 DSD
- After I did an update to the newest FW, I got the suspicion it improved a tiny bit.
- Is the 2nd best option of all options that I've listed to.

# The QB9 Twenty:

- Has more texture
- Reverb isolates and decays better into dark silence
- The overall sound embraces you more
- Treble is more silky (maybe a tad too silky?)

Answer: The QB9 Twenty is overall better!

# 3 - Aurender NH100/AyreQB-9 Twenty vs Ayre EX-8 plus ROON




Vraag; which streamer is better.

Playing the same source file via the Aurender or via my iMac as the ROON core and the EX-8 as the audio device (no other in-between audio drivers). The Ayre EX-8 with ROON sounds:

- Flatter again; it lacks openness and air. Despite it also sounds spacious and holographic, it is as if the members of an orchestra (CPE Bach) sit closer together. With the QB9, the image opens up, and the orchestra gets more width and depth (in the sense of its reverb). Now the orchestra plays in a hall, where also the side walls of the orchestra hall are audible.
- Timbre is flatter with less texture.
- There is no rest, the notes don't decay out, and the emphasis is on the attack of the new notes.

Answer: The Aurender NH100 sounds better than ROON via the EX-8

## 4 - Aurender NH100 own data vs ROON



Question; which data stream & signal path is better. ROON plays via AirPlay to the Aurender

- ROON sounds flatter again; there is a lack of openness and air/space. Has more attack, and a bit "harder sound character"; treble is a bit more fierce.
- Playing the same file form the Aurender HD directly is more silky, has more micro dynamics, timbre, and intonatieon. It sound less blunt. E.g.
  - False air in a sax tube has more character, flanging, ssfffrrrr sounds (Andy Sheppard)
  - The hobo (Couperin) has more "tube" and reed with the Aurender, and therefore has more space for intonation and decay.

Answer: The Aurender NH100 sounds better stand-alone than with ROON via Airplay

#### Conclusions:

- ROON sound less good in all cases; even via the same electronic path (via the Aurender) a negative effect is audible. This matches other experiences with ROON in different setups with friends (e.g. JPlay being better than ROON)
- The Ayre QB-9 Twenty DAC sounds better than the DAC in the Ayre EX-8
- The Ayre EX-8 amplifier is a big step-up to the AX-7e amplifier
